


In 2022, **21.9** million domestic and international travelers visit DC, spending **\$8.1** billion, which supported more than **84,111** jobs and generated **\$1.6** billion in local tax revenues, according to research commissioned by Destination DC. These numbers are substantial, but they don't tell the whole story. Neighborhoods across DC are promoting their cultural, natural, and historic assets to tell their stories, deliver remarkable travel experiences, and drive economic vitality.

The key segments that make tourism an engine of growth for DC, include:

In 2022, **39.4 million** park visitors spent an estimated **\$973 million** in DC's neighborhoods supporting a total of **9,140** jobs with a payroll of **\$489 million**, according to the *National Park Service Visitor Spending Effects Report*.
