

NORTH CAROLINA


In 2022, approximately **43 million** domestic and international travelers visited North Carolina, spending **\$33.3 billion**, which supported **216,900** jobs with a payroll of **\$8.7 billion** and generated **\$4.2 billion** in federal, state, and local tax revenues, according to research by Tourism Economics. These numbers are substantial but they don't tell the whole story. Communities across North Carolina are promoting their cultural, natural, and historic assets to tell their stories, deliver remarkable travel experiences, and drive economic vitality.

The key segments that make tourism an engine of growth for North Carolina include:

National Park Service: There are 12 national parks in North Carolina:

- Appalachian National Scenic Trail (runs across CT, GA, MA, MD, ME, NC, NH, NJ, NY, PA, TN, VA, VT, WV)
- Blue Ridge Parkway (runs across NC, VA)

- Carl Sandberg Home National Historic Site
- Fort Raleigh National Historic Site
- Great Smoky Mountains National Park

- Overmountain Victory National Historic Trail (runs across NC, SC, TN, VA)
- Trail of Tears National Historic Trail (runs through AL, AR, GA, IL, KY, MO, NC, OK, TN)


